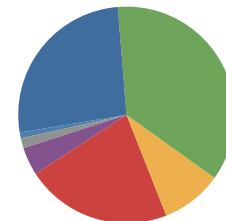
Kiplinger's ranks Georgia College one of the top 100 values in public higher education in the United States.
