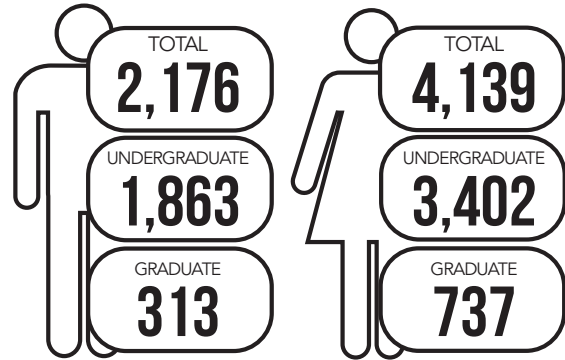
**ABOUT

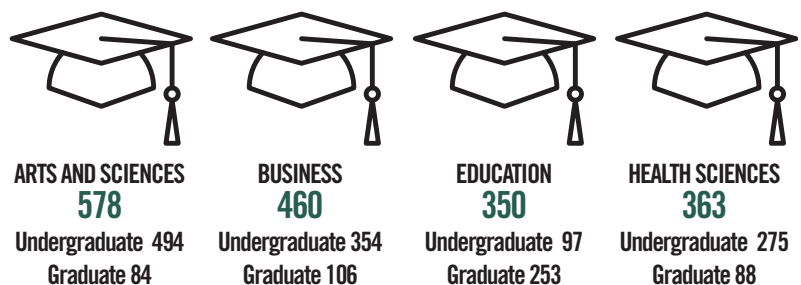

The 2022 U.S. News & World Report Best Colleges report ranked GCSU as a Top Public Regional University. Designated 22nd among the top public regional universities in the south, GCSU was the state's highest-ranked university in this category for the fourth year in a row.
