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

eorgia College is Georgia's designated public liberal arts university, offering undergraduate programs of study in an inviting residential college setting to students who are motivated to make a difference in the world. Community-based Engaged Learning (C-bEL) is a common theme at the university; and the students, faculty and staff members of Georgia College collaborate with the communities of middle Georgia to provide invaluable educational experiences for our students and make enriching contributions to the local area and beyond. The university also provides graduate and professional studies, in multiple locations and online, to students who are looking to advance their careers.

Beginnings

The school was founded in 1889 in Milledgeville, Georgia, as a public women's educational center. First known as Georgia Normal & Industrial College, the university also has been named Georgia State College for Women, The Woman's College of Georgia, Georgia College at Milledgeville, Georgia College and, since 1996, Georgia College & State University.

Accreditation

Georgia College & State University is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges to award baccalaureate, master's and doctoral degrees. Colleges

Georgia College has programs of study in four colleges – the College of Arts and Sciences, the J. Whitney Bunting College of Business, the John H. Lounsbury College of Education and the College of Health Sciences.

Class Sizes

As Georgia's designated public liberal arts university, small classes that give ample opportunity for individual student attention are common. Most class sections enroll between 15 and 35 students. Seminars, tutorials and honors courses typically enroll 20 to 25 students with three faculty facilitators.

Total Economic Impact Locally

The economic impact of the university on a six-county region is calculated to be more than \$235 million, according to a study released in 2016 by the University System of Georgia.

Tuition and Fees Fiscal Year 16-17

Tuition and fees for a full-time undergraduate student who is a resident of the state of Georgia are \$4,601 per semester. Out-of-state tuition for full-time undergraduate students is \$13,775 per semester.

Strategic Directions 2016 – 2021

On Nov. 9, 2015, President Dorman charged the Strategic Planning Steering Committee and the chairs of the 13 subcommittees with the task of developing a strategic plan to position Georgia College for preeminence as a public liberal arts institution. Each strategic planning subcommittee was asked to address the question: "What would have to happen to make Georgia College the preeminent public liberal arts institution in the future?" An overarching projection of the scenario in 10 years (2025) was provided to the subcommittees, and the subcommittees were asked to consider this possible future while preparing a strategic plan to serve the university from 2016-2021.

As a result of the Strategic Planning Steering Committee's work, the following goals and initiatives were proposed:

Goal 1: Recruit, admit, enroll, retain and graduate highly qualified and diverse undergraduate students.

Goal 2: Develop and implement distinctive and transformative undergraduate curricular and co-curricular experiences. Transformative experiences include, but are not limited to: undergraduate research; creative projects; study abroad; service learning; community-based learning; leadership development; diversity and global learning; and field and clinical-based practica, apprenticeships, preceptorships and internships.






Distribution of Revenue by Source Fiscal Year 2015-16



Expenditures by Function Fiscal Year 2015-16






In fall 2016, the Career Center piloted the Career Planning Milestones program with the Class of 2019. In the pilot year, student participation in career development activities increased across all undergraduate populations.

- As of summer 2016, the Career Center has eight full-time positions dedicated to career advising.
- 94% of first-year students completed a career assessment.
- 76% of first-year students participated in classroom presentations about their career assessment results.
- Although not in the official pilot, sophomores, juniors and seniors participated in the Career Planning Milestones as well. Collectively, these classes increased their participation in resume reviews and mock interviews by 25%.
- Over 50% of the undergraduate student population used the Career Center in FY2016.







Distribution of Degree and Major Awards by Degree Level, Fiscal Year 2015-16










