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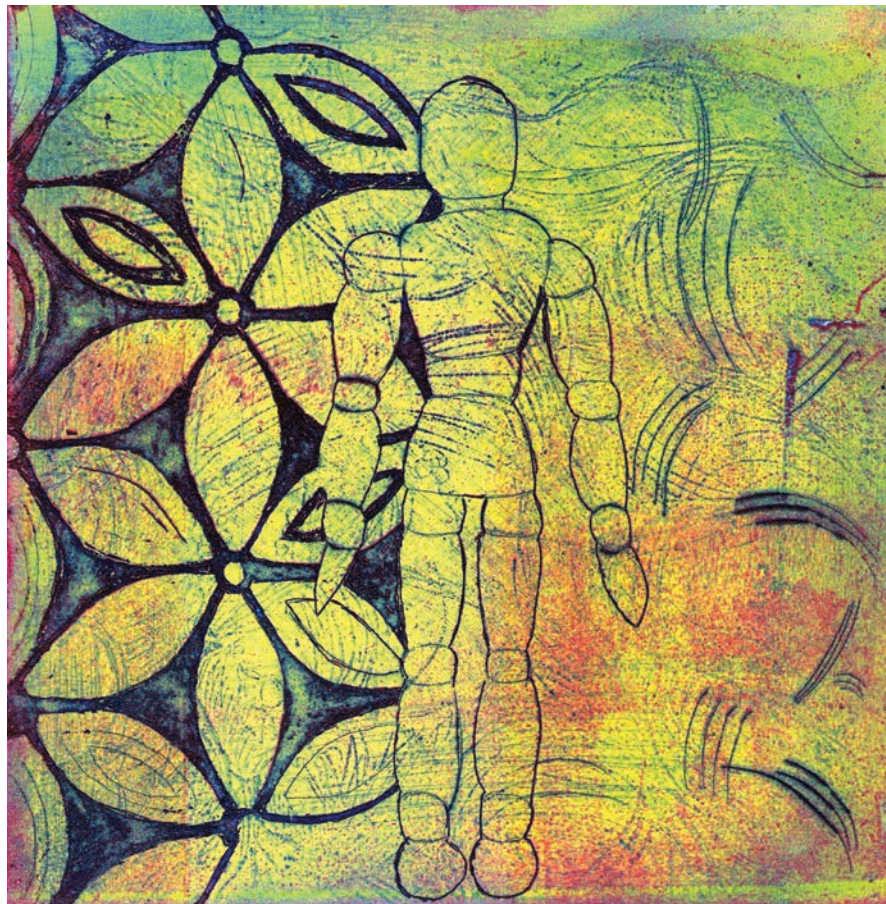

# ABOUT THE INSTITUTION

**G**eorgia College is Georgia's designated public liberal arts university, offering undergraduate programs of study in an inviting residential college setting to students who are motivated to make a difference in the world. Community-based learning is a common theme at the university; and the students, faculty and staff members of Georgia College collaborate with the communities of middle Georgia to provide invaluable educational experiences for our students and make enriching contributions to the local area and beyond. The university also provides graduate and professional studies, on campus and online, to students who are looking to advance their careers.

## Beginnings

The school was founded in 1889 in Milledgeville, Georgia, as a public women's educational center. First known as Georgia Normal & Industrial College, the university also has been named Georgia State College for Women, the Women's College of Georgia, Georgia College, and, since 1996, Georgia College & State University.

## Accreditation

Georgia College & State University is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools Commission on Colleges to award baccalaureate, master's and doctorate degrees. ## Colleges

Georgia College has programs of study in four colleges – the College of Arts and Sciences, the J. Whitney Bunting College of Business, the John H. Lounsbury College of Education and the College of Health Sciences.

## Class Sizes

As Georgia's designated public liberal arts university, small classes that give ample opportunity for individual student attention are common. Most class sections enroll between 15 and 35 students. Seminars, tutorials and honors courses typically enroll 20 to 25 students with three faculty facilitators.

## Total Economic Impact Locally

The economic impact of the university on a six-county region is calculated to be more than \$284 million, according to a study released in 2018 by the University System of Georgia.

## Tuition and Fees Fiscal Year 18-19

Tuition and fees for a full-time undergraduate student who is a resident of the state of Georgia are \$4,673 per semester. Out-of-state tuition for full-time undergraduate students is \$14,030 per semester.

## Vision, Values and Mission

### Vision

Georgia College will be a nationally preeminent public liberal arts university.

### Values

The Georgia College experience, which is rooted in the liberal arts and provides the foundation for a lifetime of learning, growth and academic excellence, is based on these shared values:

- The pursuit of knowledge and truth for the public good;
- The transformative effect of service, leadership and collaborative engaged learning experiences both in and beyond the classroom;
- Ethical principles including integrity, altruism, reason, respect and responsibility in discourse and actions;
- Diversity and inclusion in all forms.

### Mission

Georgia College is the state's only designated public liberal arts university.

## Strategic Directions 2016 – 2021

On Nov. 9, 2015, President Dorman charged the Strategic Planning Steering Committee and the chairs of the 13 subcommittees with the task of developing a strategic plan to position Georgia College for preeminence as a public liberal arts institution. Each strategic planning subcommittee was asked to address the question: What would have to happen to make Georgia College the preeminent public liberal arts institution in the future? An overarching projection of the scenario in 10 years (2025) was provided to the subcommittees, and the subcommittees were asked to consider this possible future while preparing a strategic plan to serve the university from 2016-2021.

As a result of the Strategic Planning Steering Committee's work, the following Goals and Initiatives were proposed:

**Goal 1:** Recruit, admit, enroll, retain and graduate highly-qualified and diverse undergraduate students.

**Goal 2:** Develop and implement distinctive and transformative undergraduate curricular and co-curricular experiences. Transformative experiences include but are not limited to: undergraduate research; creative projects; study abroad; service learning; community-based learning; leadership development; diversity and global learning; and field and clinical-based practica, apprenticeships, preceptorships and internships.

**Goal 3:** Offer a limited number of exceptional quality graduate programs that are highly relevant to workforce demand and supportive of the university mission.

**Goal 4:** Align resources through generation, redirection, prioritization, cost containment and stewardship to address strategic priorities.

**Goal 5:** Enhance a professional environment that encourages the recruitment, retention and success of an exemplary and diverse faculty and staff.

**Goal 6:** Strengthen community and regional ties through service, research, programs and partnerships that enhance economic, educational and cultural opportunities to improve the quality of life for citizens of Milledgeville/Baldwin County and the middle Georgia region.

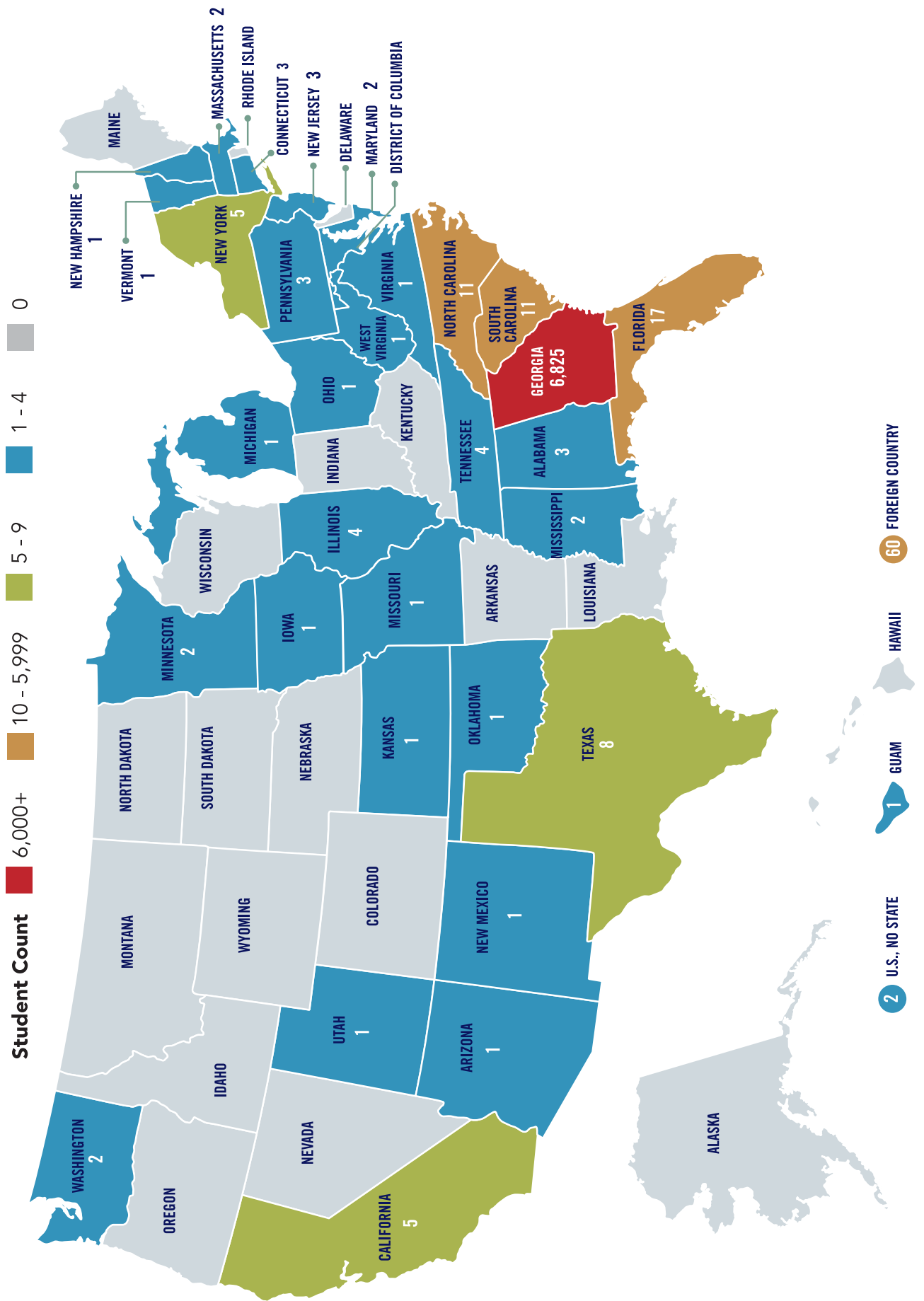

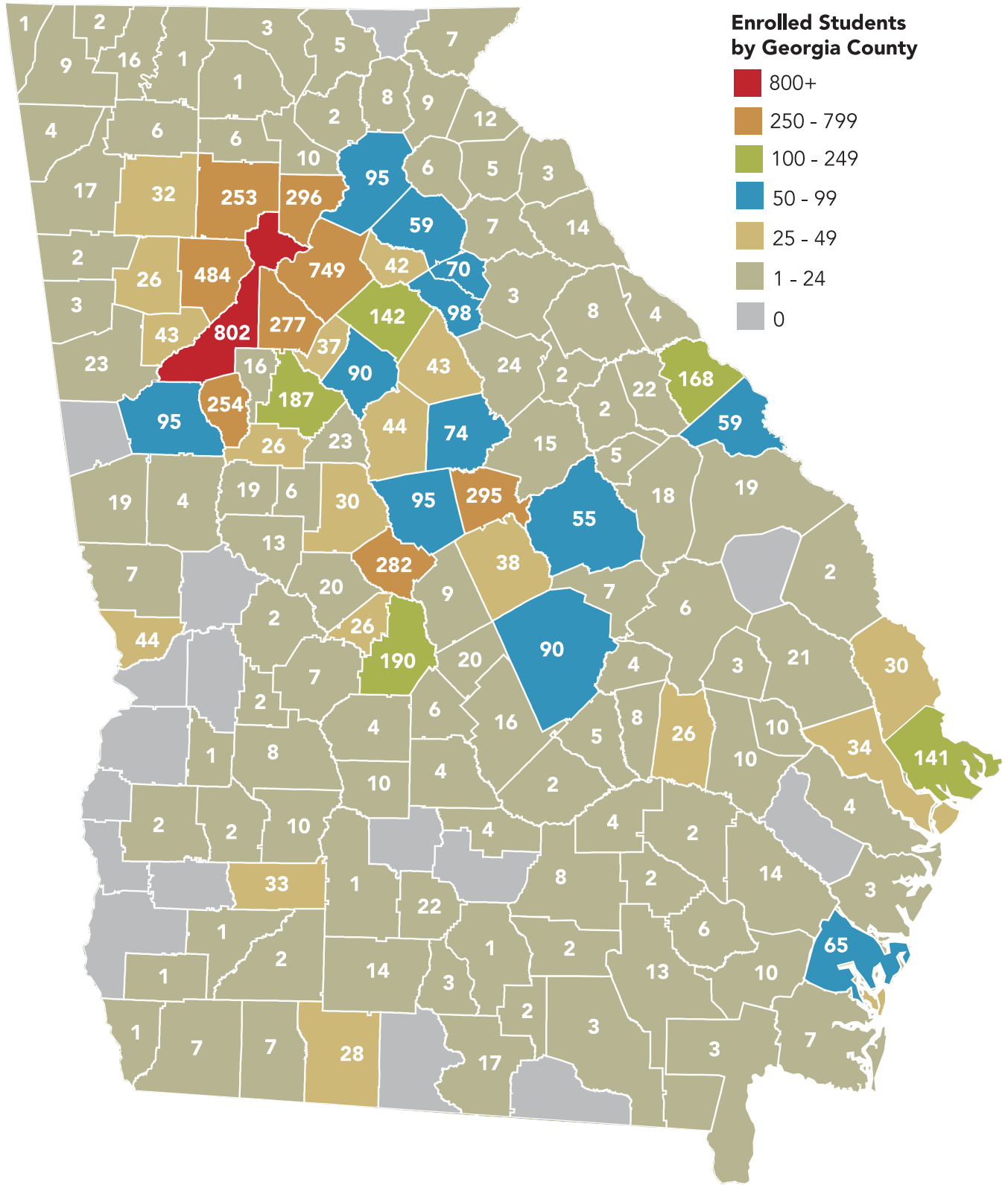

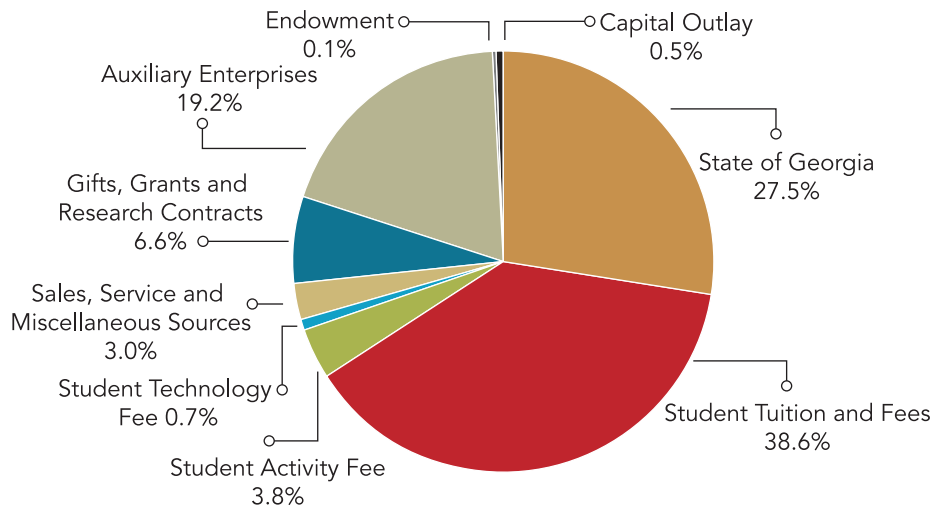

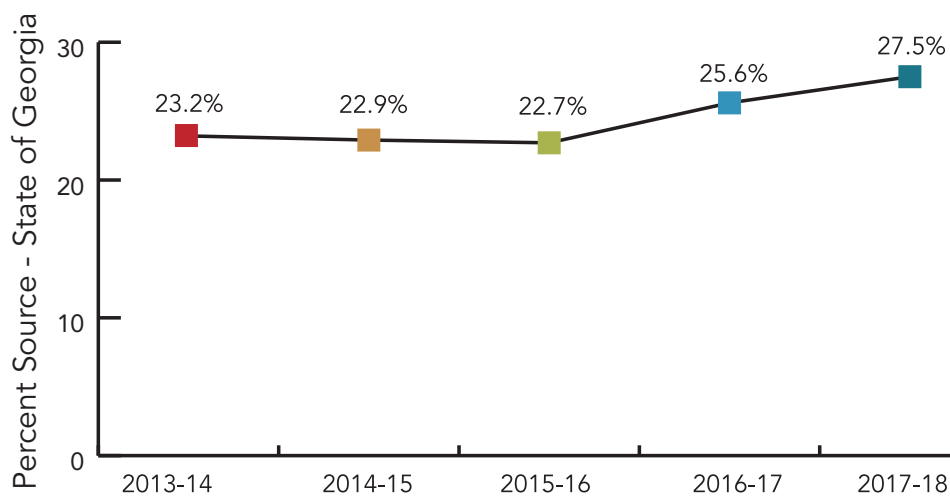
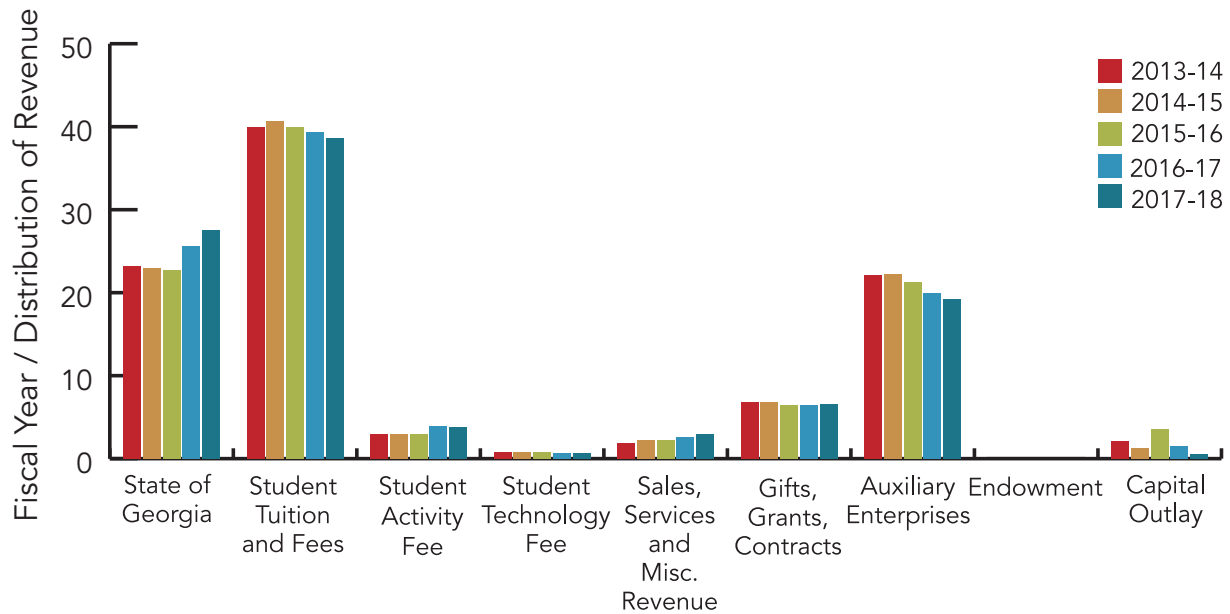
### Distribution of Revenue by Source Fiscal Year 2017-18

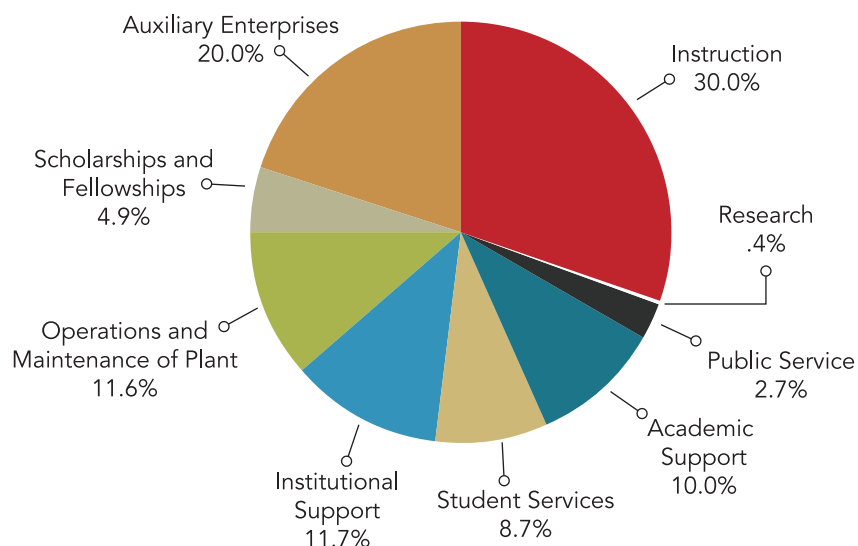

## Distribution of Expenditures by Source Fiscal Year 2017-18

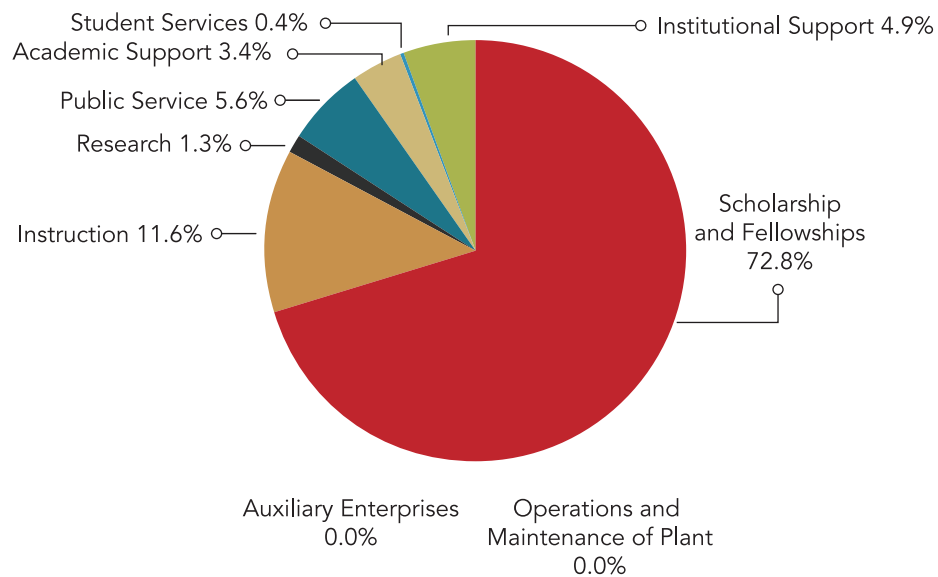

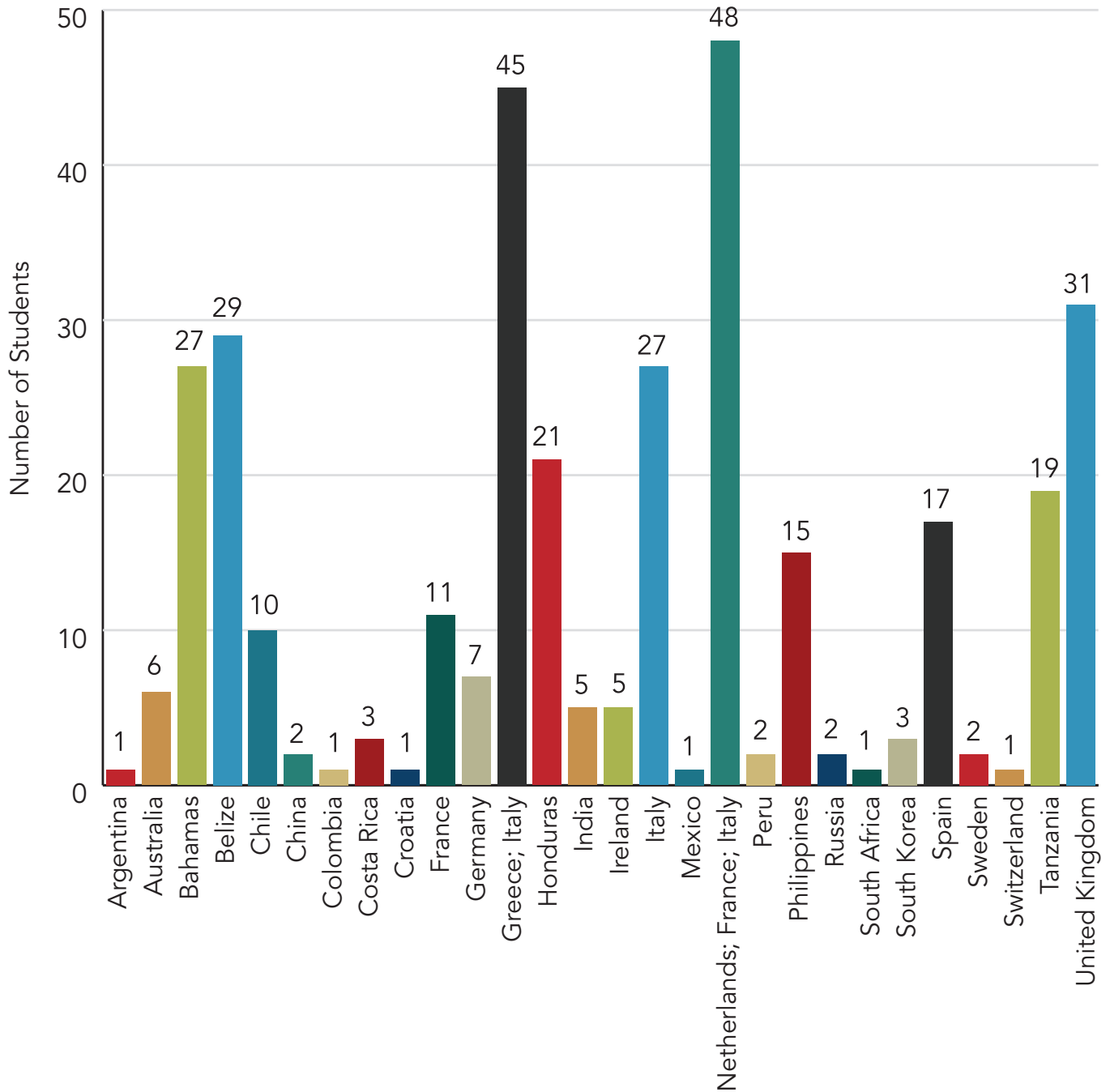

## NOTES FROM FY 2018, FY 2017 AND FY 2016

1. Decrease due to weeding (purposeful de-selection of library materials to keep collection relevant).
2. Increase due to the reporting of ebook titles from new collections available through GALILEO, the addition of Open Access collections to the library's catalog and selection/purchase of individual ebooks throughout the year.
3. GALILEO ebsco ebook collections added for FY17.
4. Increase is due to FY16 acquisition of eBrary Academic Complete (ebook collection).
5. The decrease from last year is due to moratorium on GIL Express for USG library system migration.
6. Decline in full text downloads from FY17 to FY18 attributed in part to recalculation of how ProQuest database statistics are recorded. General decline in full text downloads reported from most individual databases.
7. The decrease from last year is partially due to the increased use of the consultation program. The consultation program contributed to an additional 24 classes and reaching approximately 619 students in the 2017-2018 academic year.
8. Decrease is primarily attributed to a decline in the number of group-type sessions for the Freshman Seminar activity. During the 2015-2016 academic year, the activity was completed exclusively by students on an individual basis.
9. The decrease from last year is partially due to the increased use of the consultation program. The consultation program contributed to an additional 24 classes and reaching approximately 619 students in the 2017-2018 academic year.
10. Decrease is in correlation with the decline in instruction sessions.
11. The decrease from last year is due to sending 1st-generation iPads to surplus at suggestion of IT.
12. The decrease from last year is from loss of equipment due to age and/or damage from use.
13. The decrease from last year is due to loss of equipment due to age and/or damage from use.
14. Increase is due to addition of end-of-FY15 purchases of video cameras.

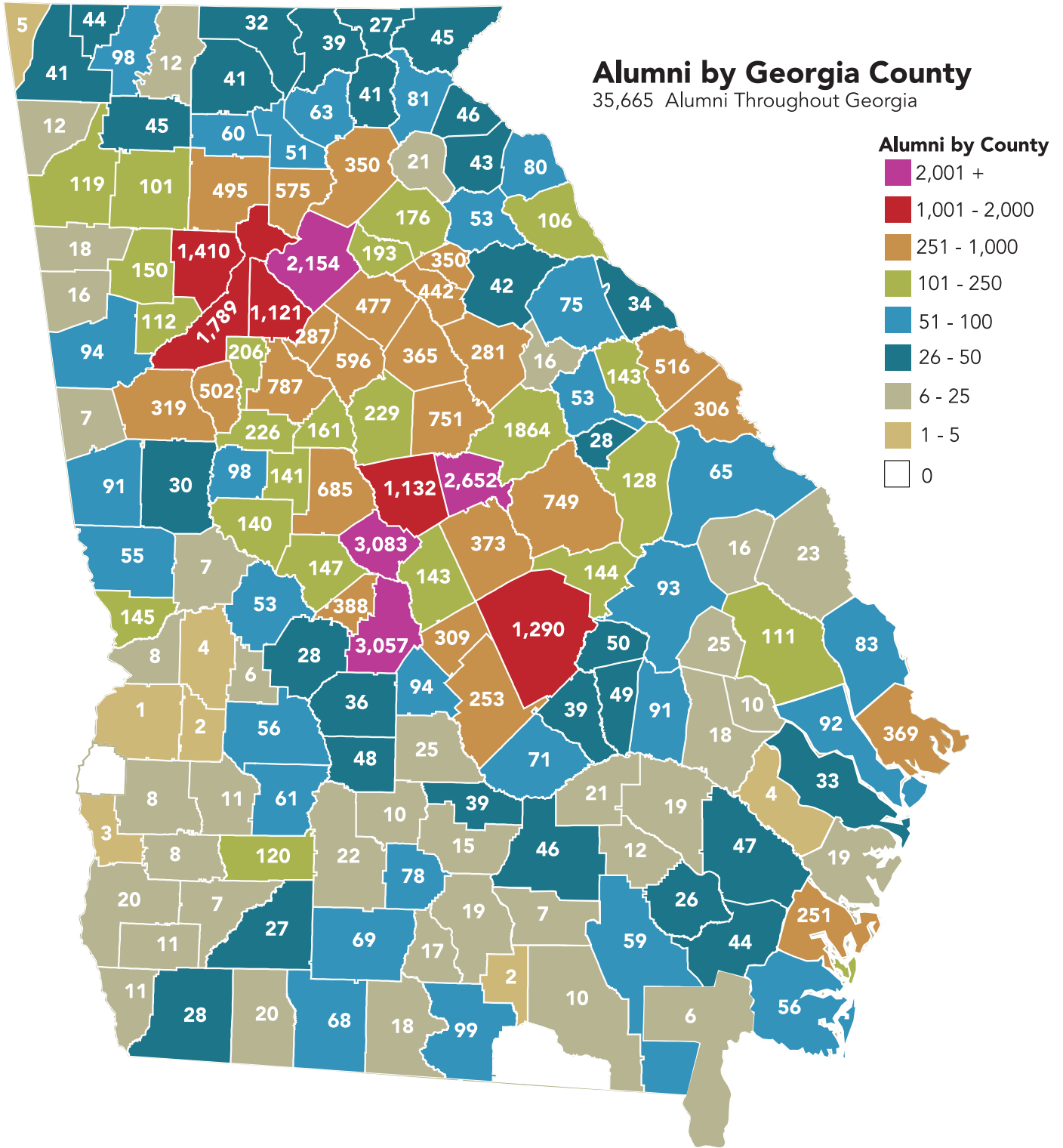

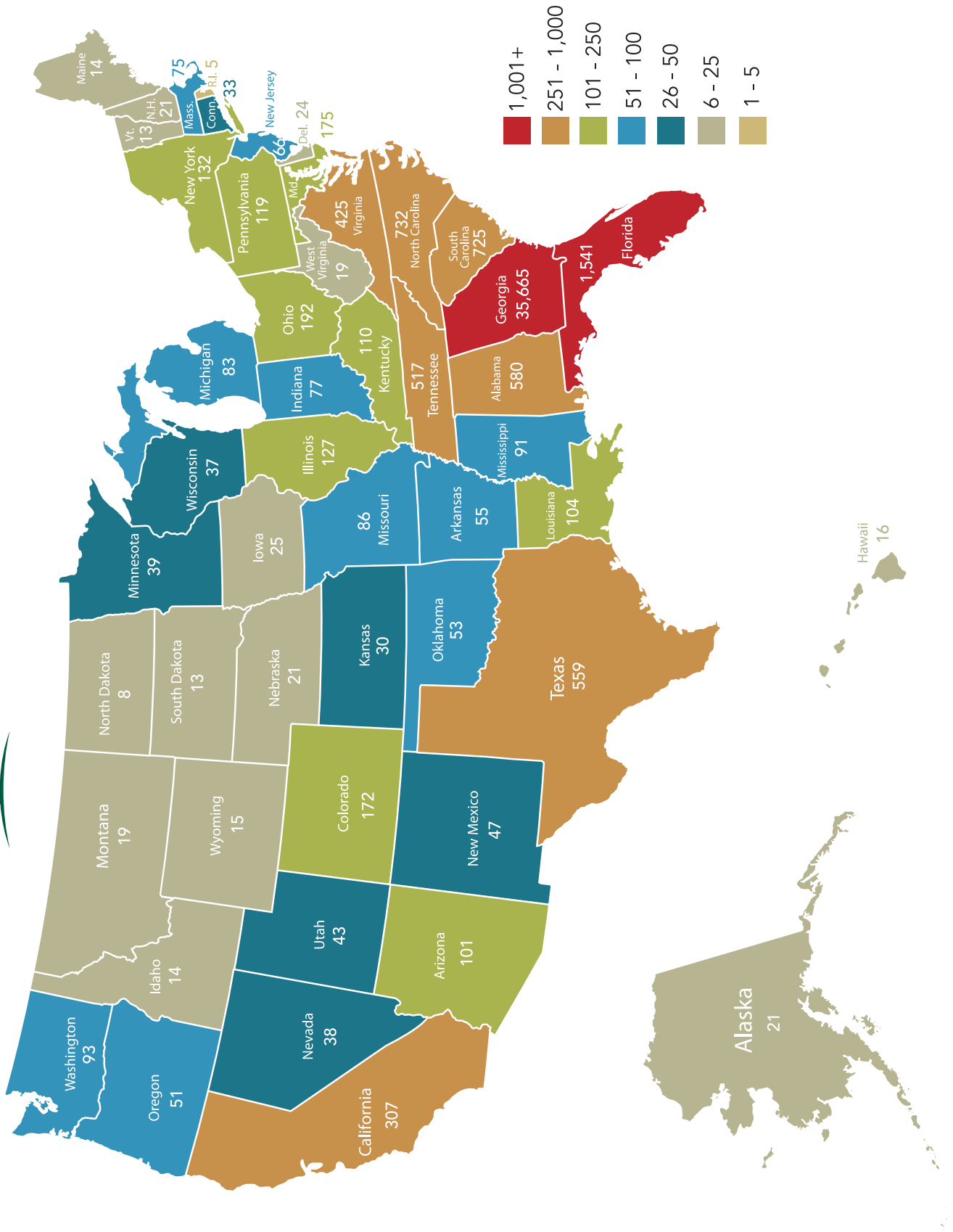
## Alumni by Georgia County

## Athletics 2017-18 Points of Pride

- Bobcat Baseball spent three weeks as the No. 1 team in the nation, had three All-Americans, the Region Player and Pitcher of the Year and, for the first time in the storied program's history, had three players chosen in the Major League Baseball Draft.
- The Bobcats had six student-athletes win Peach Belt Player of the Year honors: Katherine Yost in cross country, Amanda Bartholomew in soccer, Kayla Brockway was the Setter of the Year in volleyball, Jordan Thomas was the Freshman of the Year in men's basketball, Logan Mattix was the Player of the Year in baseball, Charlie Hecht was the Pitcher of the Year in baseball.
- GC Softball seniors Hannah Coursey and Holland Coursey, as well as GC Baseball senior Logan Mattix, each earned Academic All-America status.
- Logan Mattix became the first player in our storied baseball program's history to earn both All-American and Academic All-American in the same season.
- Georgia College had two winners of the Peach Belt Conference (PBC) Elite -15 Award for top GPA at a sport's conference championship tournament: Brian Skoglund from men's cross country and Hannah Coursey from softball.
- Seven of the school's 11 varsity sports advanced to NCAA Postseason action.
- The Bobcat Athletic teams posted a 3.24 GPA for the 2017-18 academic year, with eight of the teams coming in at a 3.0 or above.
- Georgia College Baseball won its fourth PBC Tournament Championship in the last six years.
- The Bobcats won two Peach Belt Coach of the Year honors, as Gretchen Krumdieck did so for volleyball and Jason Eller for baseball.
- Bobcat Tennis saw the women make the NCAA Regional for the 24th straight season and the men qualify for the 12th straight year.

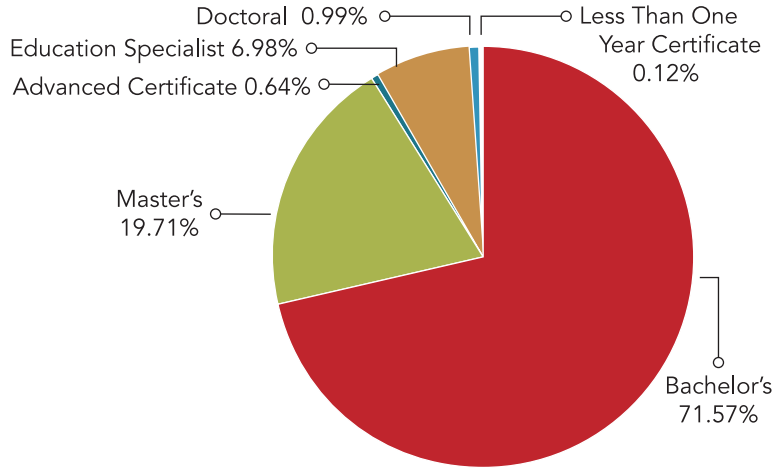

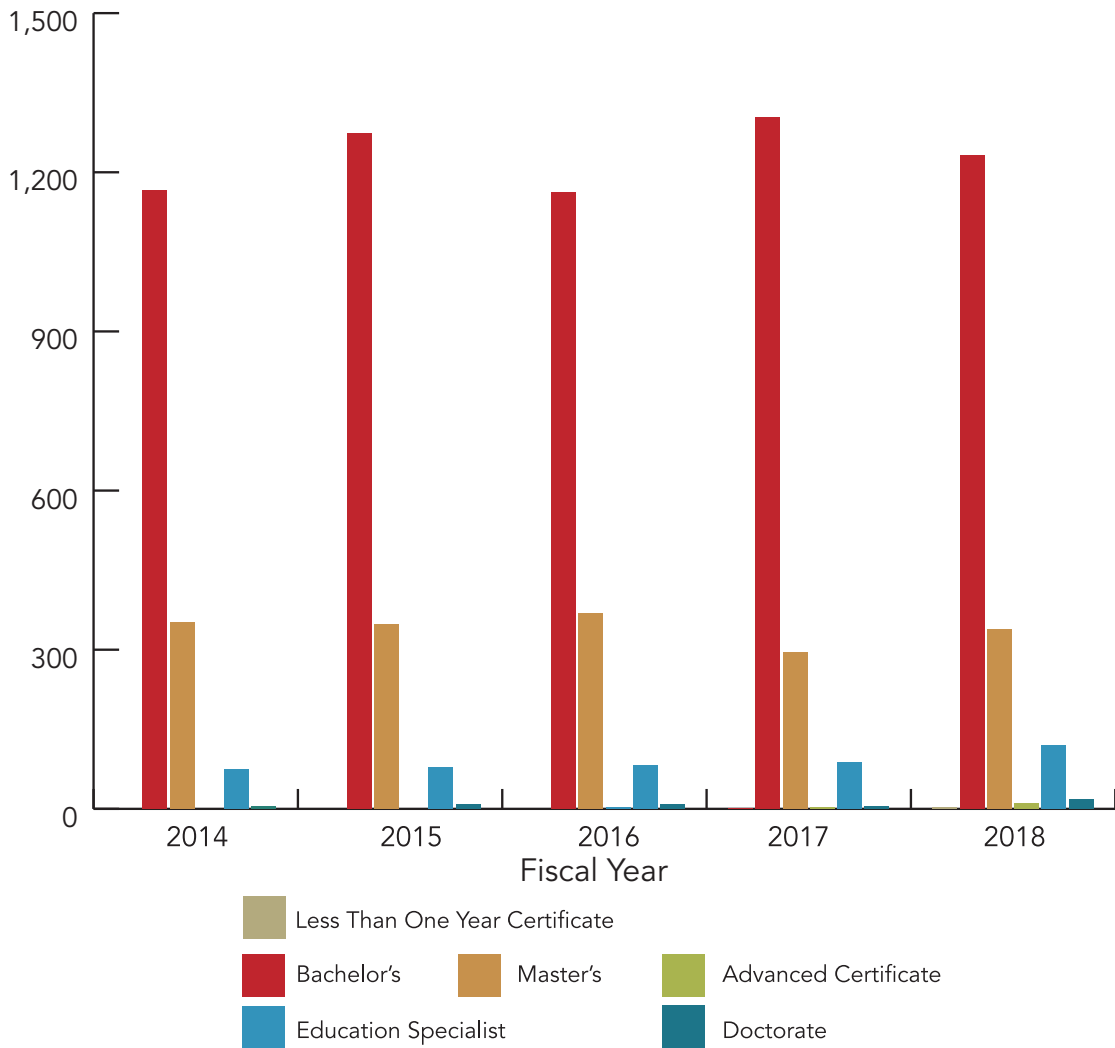

### Number of Degree and Major Awards by Degree Level



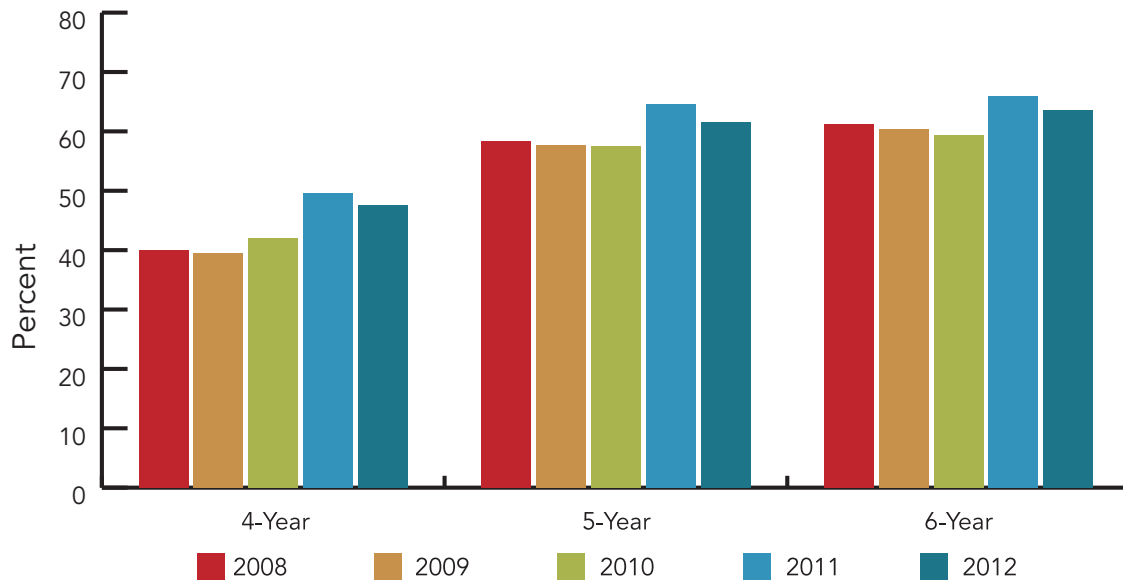

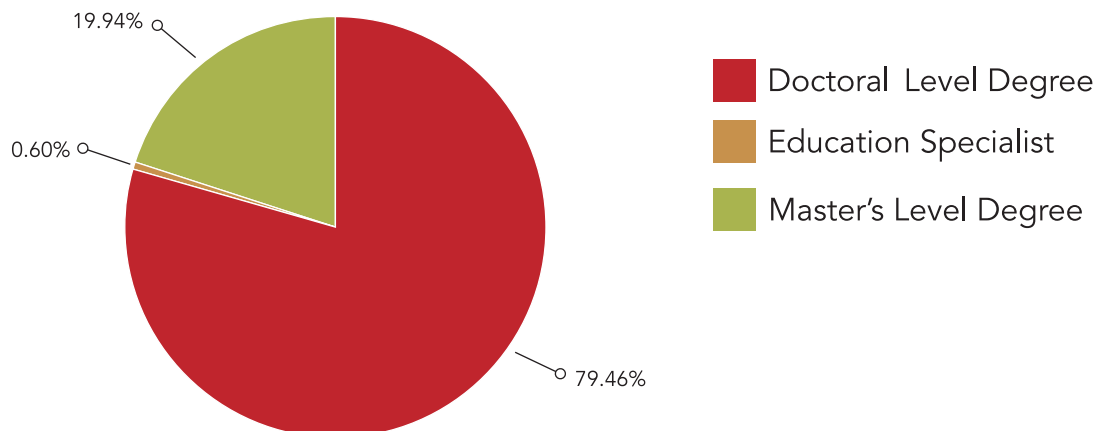
